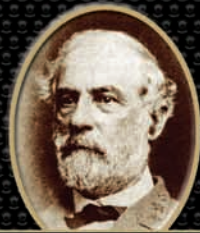

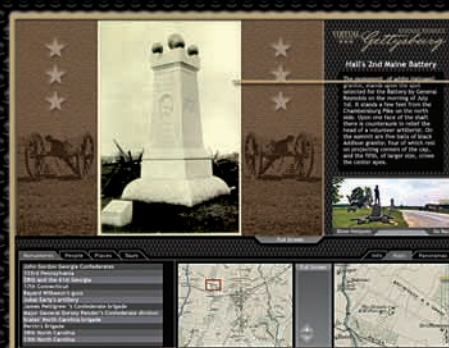
Use the navigation tools within the panorama to look in different directions, zoom in/out, and jump to different locations using "Hot Spots."

Open the "Photos" palette to view historical photos of people and places during the narrative.

The tour controls allow you to pause the guided tour and explore on your own. Click on "Resume Tour" to continue at any time.

Click on "nodes" within the full-screen interactive map to find monuments, battlefield scenes and panoramas.

Open the "Panoramas" palette to select from 99 different 360-degree panoramas of popular and hard-to-find battlefield locations.



The photo screen allows you to view hundreds of historical images of people, places, monuments and markers. You can access every monument on the battlefield as well as the text of every marker.

Find monuments visually on the battlefield using the thumbnail panorama.

Open the "Maps" palette to see your exact location on the battlefield. The zoom buttons increase and decrease your field of view.

Click the "Full Screen" button to view panoramas or images in an immersive full-screen mode.

The "Tours" palette allows you to select from any of the 21 different tours listed above. All tours are narrated by Licensed Battlefield Guide Gary Kross. You can also choose to view the introduction, the prelude to the battle, and a re-enactment of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address.
